

Grove Hall - Introduction


- Neighborhood boundaries:
 - At the intersection of Blue Hill Avenue, Washington and Warren Streets, Grove Hall links Dorchester and Roxbury.

 - Shopping mecca
 - Blue Hill Ave (main road)



About Grove Hall

- Demographics
 - o 37% lives below the poverty line
 - 30.6% of the population is under 18
 - Racial Characteristics:
 - 64.2% black
 - 29.0% Hispanic/Latino
 - 1.6% white
 - 0.8% Asian
 - 2.5% two or more races
 - 1.9% other
- Most prevalent issues facing neighborhood
 - Substance abuse
 - Concentrated disadvantage
 - No quality community center for youth
 - Over-saturation of sober homes
 - Lack of funding



Project R.I.G.H.T.

- Project R.I.G.H.T. (PRI) is a multi-faceted organization working to create establish, strengthen, and coordinate resident and youth involvement in neighborhood stabilization, economic development and community building efforts within the neighborhoods of North Dorchester and Roxbury (Greater Grove Hall) through the grassroots organizing of neighborhood residents.
- Community Meetings:
 - o Guest speakers:
 - police officers, community engagement leaders
 - \sim 30 participants present at each meeting \rightarrow mostly ages 40+
