GRMN2102 – Intermediate German II (Spring 2021, Prof. Carolin Fuchs)

Purpose

- To engage virtually with German-speaking elders through regular interviews (4x/semester) on mutually agreed topics
- While the interviews were informal and conversational in nature, studentgenerated questions were scaffolded beforehand
- Main focus of the interview was on the elders' unique experiences and perspectives rather than objective facts about a topic
- The exchange was also meant to provide participants with a broader worldview on some course themes (e.g., history, immigration)
- The exchanges provided the elders with an opportunity to engage in a multicultural dialogue during a time of COVID-19 lockdown in Germany

Goals

- Broadening our horizons beyond the classroom walls
- Practicing linguistic, pragmatic, and communicative skills
- Engaging in intercultural and intergenerational dialogue
- Obtaining first-hand information on different topics
- Practicing time-management, self-efficacy, conflict resolution

- about the struggle to get an education or have a stable career after the war during the rebuilding




Student Reflection 8
