




I. INTRODUCTION

 Objective: to ascertain a collection of quantitative data through survey questions and qualitative data through personal follow-up interviews with survey participants.




II. LITERATURE REVIEW

- "more involved students reported greater development in moving through autonomy toward interdependence and establishing and clarifying purpose. Meanwhile, uninvolved students had consistently lower developmental scores. Additionally, involvement in clubs and organizations has been shown to correlate positively with several areas of psychosocial development for undergraduate students (Foubert 2006)."
- "findings show that efforts made to strengthen organizational identification will have a greater payoff in terms of the duration of the member's relationship with the nonprofit (Di Feng, Paul W. Fombelle, Ruth N. Bolton)."
- "students who participated in numerous extracurricular activities and held officer roles scored significantly higher in the Social Responsibility Leadership Scale (SRLS)."

III. METHODS

- There are various opportunities within EWB that could greatly benefit from an interdisciplinary cohort of new members even outside engineering majors.
- Another thing we look to assess through our qualitative survey is how enticing the experience abroad through EWB is to the general student population.

 Two new members in EWB were interviewed, both firstyear engineering students.


OLD EWB MEMBERS


 Two veteran EWB members were interviewed, both being project leads in EWB Panama

Takeaways:


- New EWB members have found some club content to be too complicated for their coursework (I.e. have not taken necessary classes yet)







What is your year? 32 responses






For the club you have been with the longest, what aspect of the club do you like the most? ^{29 responses}




How many of these clubs would you say you have a vested interest in (4+ months of membership)? ²⁹ responses




How did you find out about the clubs you are apart of? 29 responses



Have you heard of the club Engineers Without Borders(EWB)? 29 responses




If you answered yes to the previous question, are you a member? ²⁸ responses











Have you heard of the club Engineers Without Borders(EWB)? 29 responses




Are you a member of any clubs on campus? 32 responses









V. DISCUSSION

Important Factors


- N=32, relatively low
- Third years and COE/COS overrepresented compared to general student body
 - Older students have more time to develop club interests -
 - -> inflates club membership and interest data

Takeaways


- There are not many non-stem members of EWB
- Most important factors in club retention
 - EWB section heads & project leads
- Long term retention most important factor is community
 - Word of mouth
 - "People" being the most liked aspect

VI. CONCLUSION

What can EWB do to attract new members?

- Increase social aspects within club
- Increase club appeal for new/younger members
- NEU club fair
- Word of mouth
 - Important: Not a single survey participant selected brochure

Data skewing

- Strong majority of respondents were third years (53.1%)
- (50%) COE and (40.6%) COS
- The number of co-op experiences were evenly split, the majority (40.6%) having experienced one co-op

Suggestions

- Implementation of a new member learning plan
- Increase number of purely social events in EWB
- Recruitment of members from different backgrounds
 - Increase diversity
 - Interdisciplinary work made easier; grants, business affairs, Spanish
