This Spring 2022 section of ARCH 6440 focuses on Community-Engaged Design. Leaning into Northeastern's location in Boston's District 7, the course partners with Tania Anderson, the newly-elected city councilor for the district, piloting a series of action research techniques together with the District 7 Team.
