I was paired with a young man who had absolutely zero interest in writing his college essay...He was overwhelmed with the college process, and deeper than that, he didn't feel as though he had a story worth sharing. I closed his computer and asked him to look at me. We took some breaths and then just talked for about forty minutes. It turns out he had an incredibly interesting story.... Finally, a lightbulb went off for him, and with about ten minutes left, he began furiously typing. I simply sat back and listened and he went between writing and talking about his essay idea, one that he was truly passionate about. He left happy and relieved, and I felt incredibly proud of both myself and him for what we had accomplished in that too-short hour".
