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Introduction to Service Site



- Provides medically tailored meals (MTMs) to "chronically and critically ill individuals and their families"
- Since their founding in 1990, have provided more than 10 million MTMs to clients across MA
- Can accommodate 15 different diet types, including diabetic, cardiac, renal, mild, vegetarian, and youth wellness
- In addition to MTMs, has a "teaching kitchen"
 - Teaches both people in need of MTMs and people seeking job education
- Participation in research to support ideas of food as medicine

Disciplines & Perspectives

Evelyn - Health Science & Psychology

- Dual focus- science of the disease itself, as well as the impacts of social determinants
- Healthy food as a vital factor in healthcare
- How to reduce hospital/ER visits by addressing non-clinical health factors

Zach - Chemical Engineering

- Food processing industry
- Positives sterilization, vacuum packaging; minimizing food-borne illnesses
- Negatives extrusion cooking; making food easier to digest and addictive

Disciplines & Perspectives

Michelle - Biochemistry and Data Science

- Biochemistry perspective on issue: how nutrients from various foods can impact disease progression on a molecular level
- Data Science perspective on issue: can use Al to tailor nutritional guidelines

How Our Disciplines Are Connected

- Our three fields show different parts of nutrition/food industry
 - o Biochemistry and Data Science development
 - Chemical Engineering manufacturing
 - Health Science and Psychology delivery to people
- Having these perspectives allow for improving community health
 - Better understanding of healthy and nutritious food because of the intersection of our disciplines

Community Analysis

C.S. located in Boston's Jamaica Plain neighborhood

- The "two JPs" reflect the gap between the experiences of the lower socioeconomic status areas and affluent areas of Jamaica Plain
- High crime rates

- Associated with worse health outcomes, such as higher blood pressure and rates of cardiovascular

disease

- Lots of green spaces and parks
- Community centers and cultural events
- Accessible public transportation

What factors create the need for an organization like Community Servings?

- Financial Strain of Healthcare
- Health Literacy
- Unemployment



Community Analysis

Assets

- Large building in JP with teaching & volunteer kitchens, garden
- 98 paid employees, including volunteer coordinator
- Donors- include big companies such as Amazon and CVS
- Community Partners for referrals and food itself- several area hospitals, local farms
- NIH grants

Constraints

- Increasing demand for services
- Volunteer Turnover
 - Many volunteers college students or part of mission trips, ie not permanent Boston residents
- Only open weekdays
- Currently only serves MA and RI
- Perishable resources and human error



Interventions



- 3 Sections of Kitchen
 - Meal packaging portioning and packaging into meal trays
 - Production chopping, peeling, and cutting
 - Soup/bag packing portioning of side dishes, desserts, and soups; packaging meals into bags and boxes ready for delivery
 - Miscellaneous tasks preparing for events, loading delivery trucks

- Goals

- Understanding the scale of operation
 - New Mansfield location
 - Delivery as far as western
 MA and RI
- Learning about different diets
 - 15 offered including general wellness, common allergies, and medical conditions such as diabetes or cardiac health

- Additional Data Collection (hypothetical)
 - # of clients throughout the years
 - # of clients on each meal plan
 - # of clients in specific neighborhoods
 - Especially relevant considering Mansfield expansion

Sustainability

- Volunteer Engagement
 - College students in service learning courses
 - College students who continue with their service site after course is over
 - Various local groups/companies
 - People who are retired and looking for ways to give back
- Community Outreach and Marketing
 - Make sure that people who need this service know about it
 - Make sure that people looking to volunteer somewhere know about this organization

- Government Funding and Donations
 - \circ 501(c)(3) nonprofit \rightarrow receives funding from the government
 - Accepts donations
 - Need to have the funds to operate
 - Money for food, packing materials, and paying staff
- Minimizing Waste
 - Volunteers try not to waste food, even though accidents and spillages can happen

Conclusion

- Community Servings values and mission
 - Values: community, connection, inclusion, and nourishment
 - Mission statement: everyone has access to nutritious food as a right
- Volunteering services at Community Servings
 - Food production and packing
- Community Servings Assets and Constraints
 - Large building with teaching & volunteer kitchens, a garden, 98 paid employees, including volunteer coordinator, donations from big companies, community partners with companies and universities
 - o Increasing demand for services, high volunteer turnover, only open weekdays, currently only serves MA and RI
- Impact of Community Servings on Jamaica Plain
 - Potential place of employment
 - Addressing lack of access to a reliable food source
- Sustainability factors of Community Servings
 - Volunteer Engagement, Community Outreach and Marketing, Government Funding and Donations, and Minimizing Waste
