

Literature Review


- Present estimates state that up to 25% of all waste in landfills is compostable
- Northeastern says its 80%
- Northeastern says 500 tons is composted annually on Campus
- Dramatic increase in composting when Covid hit
- Significant resources available at other schools but not Northeastern




- Campus wide survey

Results pt. 1; Who's out there


- We collected results from 31 respondents

Do you live on or off campus? 31 responses










What do people know about composting in Boston – OFF CAMPUS

- Few know where their Project Oscar bin is located, much less how to use it


Would you appreciate instruction on how to use project Oscar and curbside pickup? 13 responses






Would you use a Project Oscar bin if it was put in your neighborhood?






Do you know where the closest Project Oscar bin is in your neighborhood?

If your composting bin breaks what should you do? 12 responses




Cry

Which of these composting resources are you aware of? Select all that apply:





Do you know how to use Boston's Curbside Pickup program? 13 responses




Are you aware of the composting resources avilable to you ? 13 responses
